WHAT WAS THE OUTCOME?

The Auckland Battalion was ordered to charge in broad daylight and got massacred by Turkish machine gunners.

When the Wellington Battalion was ordered to charge Lieutenant-colonel William Malone refused to send his men out to commit suicide so the attack was postponed until nightfall.

On the pre dawn of August 8th 1915 the Wellington Battalion swiftly moved up the ridge and captured the summit that had been abandoned by the Turkish. The New Zealand soldiers held the summit supported by United Kingdom soldiers until the 10th of August when the allies were forced to retreat by massive Turkish counter attacks.

The Allies retreated to the Apex (a ridge line about 1 kilometre from the summit) where they held their ground until the end of the campaign.

The Allies suffered 6000 casualties.

The Turkish suffered 10,000 casualties.
